



2022 Covid 19 Travel Requirements and Entry in Canada

We look forward to having every one on board this year... but travel has become a little more regulated due to measures to curb Covid 19 so it is important to be prepared before you travel.

Vaccination

Everyone arriving at Ole's must be fully Vaccinated for Covid 19 (have a minimum of the first 2 doses of approved vaccines at least 2 weeks prior to arrival) and bring proof of Vaccination with them to board their flight along with ID.

Your flight to Ole's

Check in at Central Mountain Air (CMA) at the Charter Kiosk in the Vancouver South Terminal by 7:30 am PDT on flight day – have your ID and Vaccine passport ready for the clerk. Masks are mandatory.

Take anything with batteries, or items such as camera equipment into the cabin with you or take the batteries out and bring them into the cabin. Fishing gear, knives, hooks etc will need to go in as checked luggage when flying with CMA.

Arriving from out of Country

All travellers entering Canada by air, land, rail or marine vessel, must use ArriveCAN for all nonessential travel within 72 hours prior to your arrival. We recommend you do this the day before travel. [ArriveCAN](#) is mandatory and free. You will be asked to submit travel information for yourself and anyone travelling

with you that isn't submitting their own plus proof of vaccination, travel and quarantine information, but covid testing is no longer required. ArriveCAN will provide a Receipt you will need to present at the border.

Returning to Vancouver and Departing Canada

Most of those returning to other countries will no longer need a negative covid test to return home, such as guests from the USA or Dominican Republic. Check your entry information to ensure you do not need one. If you are required to test we recommend waiting to return to Vancouver to test in case a flight is delayed.

There are a number of testing facilities in Greater Vancouver ... all require prebooking your appointment 2 weeks prior...one option has a location at the airport <https://covid-medical.ca/> .
